2. Michelino – 'Dante holding a copy of the Divine Comedy' on the wall of Florence Cathedral




What is the significance of the "layers" in the sky and the circular mountain in the centre?

What is the significance of the objects between the Ambassadors? What is the possible explanation of why Holbein painted the anamorphous skull at a strange angle? What event of British history was taking place during the painting?
